Requirements for Full Program Membership	Full Program Membership Benefits
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Must be a hospital-based or hospital-linked program that provides violence prevention/intervention services to violently injured patients ● Initial referrals must be based on the treatment for violent injury or identified risk of future violent injury ● Initial contact with the client must take place in the hospital whenever possible ● Post-discharge intensive case management services are made available to all clients for <u>at least 6 months</u> ● Have a clearly stated program mission and goals and should directly relate to the <u>HAVI's mission and values.</u> ● Have been in operation for at least two full years and have had encounters (at least one in-hospital consultation and at least one in-person meeting post-discharge) with at least 50 violently injured patients ● Services are provided, when possible, by trained staff from the same or similar communities as the patients they serve ● Have at least 2.0 FTE staff assigned to the program (including a Program Manager and Frontline Worker) ● Demonstrated exposure and engagement to the HVIP model, as evidenced by participating in/attending The HAVI Annual Conference, How to Start a HVIP Workshop, site visits to HAVI member programs, and/or has been active as a HAVI emerging program for 2 years 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Two years of mentorship from an experienced program ● Affiliation with a National Professional Network ● Listing on the HAVI Website ● Member discounts to HAVI-Certified Trainings, the HAVI annual conference and eligible for frontline worker stipends ● Access to monthly learning community/workgroups on Mental Health, Policy, Research and Evaluation, and Workforce Development ● Access to HAVI Webinars ● Access to HAVI E-Newsletter

Emerging Program Membership

What is an Emerging Program?

A hospital-based or hospital-linked program that is working on bringing their program to scale, particularly in relation to:

1. Level of staffing and general infrastructure
2. Scope and degree of program services provided.
3. Number of clients served.

What is HAVI Emerging Program Membership?

1. A temporary membership status lasting no more than two years for Emerging Programs that show promise and need additional development and support to increase their capacity to become full Program Members of the HAVI.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Must be an HVIP (hospital-based, hospital-linked, or hybrid) that provides violence intervention services to patients injured through community violence ● Initial referrals must be based on the treatment for violent injury ● Initial contact with the client must take place in the hospital whenever possible ● Post-discharge intensive case management services are made available to all clients for <u>at least</u> 6 months ● Have been in operation for at least one full year and have had encounters (at least one in-hospital consultation and at least in-person meeting post-discharge) with at least 20 violently injured patients ● Have a clearly stated program mission and goals and should directly relate to the <u>HAVI's mission and values</u>. ● Services are provided, when possible, by trained staff from the same or similar communities as the patients they serve ● Have at least 2.0 FTE staff hours assigned to the program (including a PT or FT Program Manager and a PT or FT Frontline Worker(s)) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Affiliation with a National Professional Network ● Listing on the HAVI Website ● Access to monthly HAVI working groups/learning communities on Frontline Worker Development, Mental Health, Policy, Research & Evaluation, Workforce Development, and the HAVI Conference Planning Committee ● Access to HAVI Webinars ● Access to HAVI E-Newsletter
